THE NAVY IS LOOKING FOR A FEW GOOD NURSES/PAS

In the Navy Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP), you can receive 100% tuition assistance while completing an eligible physician assistant education program, plus a monthly stipend in excess of \$2,200 to help cover living expenses for up to 24 months.

Members of the Navy Nurse Corps may serve at the more than 250 Navy and medical facilities around the world. The Navy is particularly interested in recruiting family, pediatric, psychiatric and women's health nurse practitioners. Navy Nurses quickly rise to the top of their profession. They provide care, not only for military service members and their families, but also for people in need around the globe.

A word of warning: The military imposes a structured lifestyle that does not suit everyone. 


Distribution of PAs by Gender

How a NP can avoid mistakes from Day 1

Here are a few tips for conquering the initial days on a new nurse practitioner job:

- **1. Identify allies.** Identify a few friendly individuals willing to help you out.


